Bird Blog: --> Bear Blog Polar **Bears & Climate Change** by Lou Newman

Although most Polar Bears are born on land, they spend most of their time at sea. Their scientific name Ursus maritimus means "Maritime Bear" and derives from this fact. Polar Bears hunt their preferred food of seals from the edge of sea ice, often living off fat reserves when no sea ice is present. Rising temperatures cause the sea ice to melt earlier in the year and form later in the fall. CLICK HERE to learn more.



Field Guide to Fun!


