January has been a month to remember. We, in partnership with Big Waters Land Trust (formerly the Conservation Foundation), are finally breaking ground on the Quad Parcels. On a very cold and rainy day, we ushered in the next era with rewilded woodlands. This new habitat will attract many new species of birds and give us all new opportunities to interact with this amazing place. Sarasota County Commissioners Joe Neunder and Teresa Mast were present, with Commissioner Neunder speaking at the event. This project will cost more than \$5 million to complete, with only \$1.5 million raised so far. Every donation to this mission is critically important. If you are interested in

The Discovery of "Extinct" Harpy Eagles in Belize with Jamie Rotenberg Monday, Feb. 10

Dr. Jamie Rotenberg, Ecology Professor at the University of North Carolina, Wilmington, is a member of the original scientific team that rediscovered Harpy Eagles in Belize. Since then, he has led several avian-related research projects focusing on the eagles, the bird community and, most recently, forest restoration using cacao agroforestry (think chocolate!).

Now retired to Sarasota, Rotenberg describes his story as "The Adventure of a Lifetime," detailing the discovery of the northernmost documentation of Harpy Eagles.

Three cheers for the Quad Groundbreaking: It was a cold, rainy morning on Jan. 23 when board members of the Sarasota Audubon Society gathered on the Nature Center patio with representatives of Big Waters Land Trust (formerly Conservation Foundation) and Sarasota County government for a groundbreaking ceremony. The celebration marked a milestone in what's known as the "Quad Project," where acres of land will be returned to their wild state (re-wilded). This is a large-scale project that demands cooperation among various groups and generosity from many donors.

Art Update: The Wildlife Art of Judy Goldman







#### **Sad News: Peter Rice Passing**

April 5, 1947 - Jan. 17, 2025

Peter Rice, long-time SAS member and manager of SRQ Bird Alerts (SRQBA), died on Jan 17th. Peter facilitated SRQBA, which connects alerts to the national eBird database, for over 20 years, providing his 800+ subscribers with up-to-date sightings and locations of unusual and rare birds across several counties: Sarasota, Manatee, Charlotte, DeSoto, and Hardee.

We are grateful to Peter for giving all area birders the information to "go find that bird." Many of us would have missed the bird if it weren't for his notices.

Sincere condolences go to Frances, Peter's wife and partner of 54 years.
