Megan Suau, architect, speaks about her gorilla conservation work on the Ellen DeGeneres Campus of the Dian Fossey Gorilla Fund in Rwanda.

The Ellen Campus, which opened in 2022 near Rwanda's Volcanoes National Park – home to the majestic mountain gorillas – is the realization of a 20-year dream. This world-class research and education center honors Dian Fossey's legacy and furthers the mission to save gorillas from extinction.

The campus is open daily to the public, offering state-of-the-art exhibits showcasing nearly 60 years of gorilla conservation, serene nature trails and the opportunity to connect with the dedicated staff.

This is especially important in our area because as sea-level rise transforms South Florida's fringe of wetlands into open ocean, Roseate Spoonbills are moving north.

Let's celebrate here in Sarasota! Listen in the early morning on Sunday May 4th. To get you ready, click below to learn about a few common Southeastern songbirds.




